



## Reading prompt sheet    KS2

### Question examples:

#### 1. The Predictor

- Based on the chapter title, what do you think will happen?
- How might the setting influence what happens next?
- Do you think the character will change their mind? Why?
- **Sentence Stem:** "Given the evidence that..., I predict..."

#### 2. The Clarifier

- Find a "Tier 2" word (a fancy word). Can we find a synonym?
- Is there a word or sentence that doesn't make sense?
- What does the author mean by \_\_\_\_\_?
- **Sentence Stem:** "I needed to clarify... because..."

#### 3. The Questioner

- Why did the author choose to use a short, snappy sentence here?
- What is the character's motive for acting this way?
- How does the author make us feel sorry for (or dislike) this character?
- **Sentence Stem:** "A question I have about the text is..."

#### 4. The Summariser

- In 20 words or less, what was that chapter about?
- What are the three most important events we just read?
- What is the "Big Idea" or theme of this book so far?
- **Sentence Stem:** "The key message the author is sending is..."

### Sentence stem examples:

#### 1. The Predictor

- "Based on the clues in the text, I predict that..."
- "The title/subheading suggests that..."

#### 2. The Clarifier

- "I need to clarify the meaning of \_\_\_\_\_."
- "This part is confusing because \_\_\_\_\_."

#### 3. The Questioner

- "Why did the author choose the word \_\_\_\_\_ here?"
- "What evidence is there to show that the character is feeling \_\_\_\_\_?"

#### 4. The Summariser

- "The main events of this chapter were \_\_\_\_\_."
- "The most important message in this story is \_\_\_\_\_."
